Job 28:1-6, 9-12, 23-24

'Surely there is a mine for silver,
and a place for gold to be refined.
Iron is taken out of the earth,
and copper is smelted from ore.
Miners put an end to darkness,
and search out to the farthest bound
the ore in gloom and deep darkness.
They open shafts in a valley away from human
habitation;
they are forgotten by travellers,
they sway suspended, remote from people.
As for the earth, out of it comes bread;
but underneath it is turned up as by fire.
Its stones are the place of sapphires,
and its dust contains gold.
They put their hand to the flinty rock,
and overturn mountains by the roots.
They cut out channels in the rocks,
and their eyes see every precious thing.
The sources of the rivers they probe;
hidden things they bring to light.
'But where shall wisdom be found?
And where is the place of understanding?
God understands the way to it,
and he knows its place.
For he looks to the ends of the earth,
and sees everything under the heavens.

Romans 11:25-end

So that you may not claim to be wiser than you are,
brothers and sisters, I want you to understand this
mystery: a hardening has come upon part of Israel,
until the full number of the Gentiles has come
in. And so all Israel will be saved; as it is written,
'Out of Zion will come the Deliverer;

he will banish ungodliness from Jacob.'
'And this is my covenant with them,
when I take away their sins.'

As regards the gospel they are enemies of God for
your sake; but as regards election they are beloved,
for the sake of their ancestors; for the gifts and the
calling of God are irrevocable. Just as you were once
disobedient to God but have now received mercy
because of their disobedience, so they have now
been disobedient in order that, by the mercy shown
to you, they too may now receive mercy. For God has
imprisoned all in disobedience so that he may be
merciful to all.

O the depth of the riches and wisdom and
knowledge of God! How unsearchable are his
judgements and how inscrutable his ways!

'For who has known the mind of the Lord?
Or who has been his counsellor?'
'Or who has given a gift to him,
to receive a gift in return?'

For from him and through him and to him are all
things. To him be the glory for ever. Amen.

Gospel Reading: Luke 2:41-52

'Now every year his parents went to Jerusalem for
the festival of the Passover. And when he was twelve
years old, they went up as usual for the
festival. When the festival was ended and they
started to return, the boy Jesus stayed behind in
Jerusalem, but his parents did not know it. Assuming
that he was in the group of travellers, they went a
day's journey. Then they started to look for him
among their relatives and friends. When they did not
find him, they returned to Jerusalem to search for
him. After three days they found him in the temple,
sitting among the teachers, listening to them and
asking them questions. And all who heard him were
amazed at his understanding and his answers. When
his parents saw him they were astonished; and his
mother said to him, 'Child, why have you treated us
like this? Look, your father and I have been searching
for you in great anxiety.' He said to them, 'Why were
you searching for me? Did you not know that I must
be in my Father's house?' But they did not
understand what he said to them. Then he went
down with them and came to Nazareth, and was
obedient to them. His mother treasured all these
things in her heart.

And Jesus increased in wisdom and in years, and in divine and human favour.
